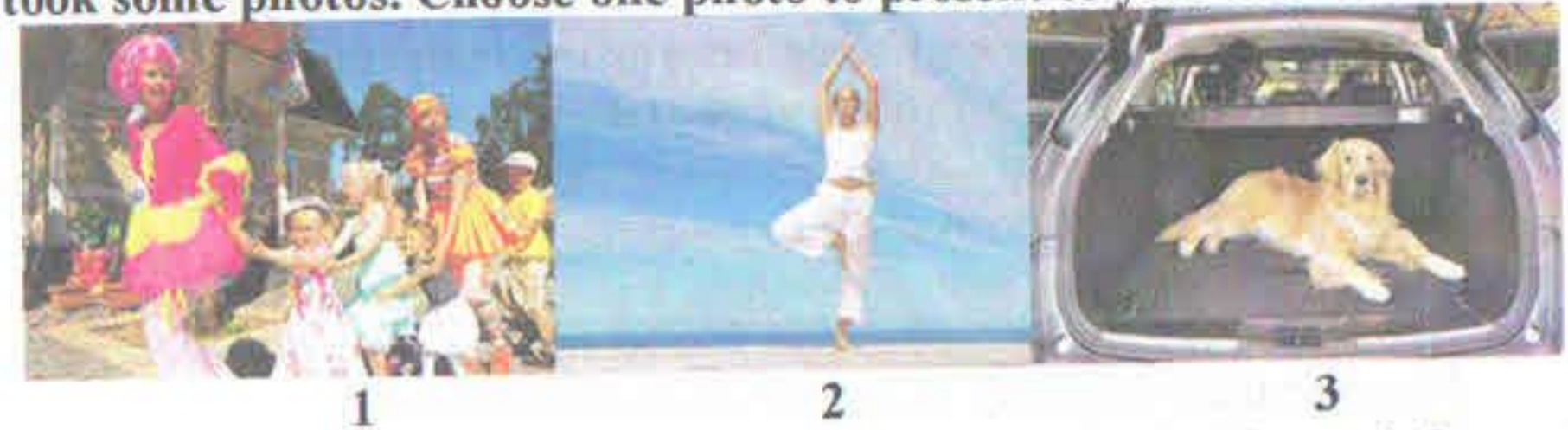

EXTREMES IN THE EARTH'S CLIMATE

The Earth is hottest near the Equator, as this is always roughly the same distance from the Sun and receives the strongest rays. The highest shade temperature ever recorded was 58 degrees in the Sahara Desert, in September 1922. In fact, the Sahara is so much hotter than anywhere else that the three countries with the highest average temperatures in the world are all in North Africa. The eastern Sahara is also the world's sunniest place with over 4,000 hours of sunshine a year, which is nearly 11 hours each day. To the south Sahara is actually getting bigger, with many square miles of previously cultivable land turning into desert every year.

The world's driest place, however, is the Atacama Desert in Northern Chile. It is such an arid area that until 1971 it had not rained there for four hundred years.

The coldest places are of course near the Poles where the sun never rises high in the sky and its rays are relatively weak. The lowest temperature ever is -89 degrees, recorded in July 1983 at the Russian scientific base in Antarctica.

TIPS FOR FLYING

As the human body was not designed for flying, people can suffer if they are on an airplane for a long time. Therefore, it is important to take certain measures to increase your comfort. If you wear loose clothing made from natural materials, such as cotton, you will feel more comfortable as your skin will be able to breathe more easily.

LIGHTNING STRIKE

It is not surprising that people in the past were afraid of lightning and thought that it was a sign of anger from the gods. In fact we still find lightning thrilling and fascinating. It is now also an important area of research for scientists, who are trying to uncover its secrets and are looking for ways to predict storms and protect people against lightning strikes.

Before scientists started this vital work people could not do very much to protect themselves or their buildings from lightning. In fact up until the eighteenth century people were given dramatic proof that lightning can really strike the same place twice. Every year a dozen people are struck by lightning in England and Wales and a quarter of those are killed as a result. Men are six times likely to become victims than women.

Things used to be much worse. The number of fatalities has dropped by eighty per cent since the mid- 1850s. This isn't because lightning is less common, but because fewer people now work in the open.
